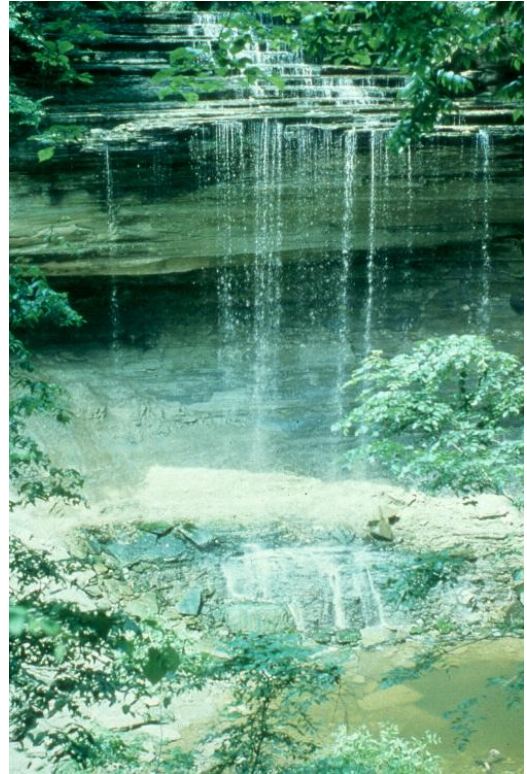

Clifty Falls State Park: Discover true southern Indiana scenic beauty. Clifty Falls offers over 1300 lush acres of scenic overlooks, 70-foot rock gorges, four waterfalls, nature center, picnic area, swimming pool, campground and various levels of hiking. One mile west of town with entrances on State Road 56 and 62, (812) 273-8885

Hanover College - Hanover College is a private, coeducational liberal arts college affiliated with the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Founded in 1827, Hanover is the oldest private college in Indiana. The College is located in southeastern Indiana on 650 acres overlooking the Ohio River. Jefferson County Historical Society Museum: The museum features changing exhibits and artifacts of local history, with Civil War, Steamboating, Stone House and Victorian Parlor permanent exhibits. 615 West 1st Street, Madison, IN 47250 (812)265-2335

Judge Jeremiah Sullivan House: Built in 1818, and considered Madison's first mansion, this home features the only known restored Federal serving kitchen on record in the country. Jeremiah helped to found Hanover College, the Indiana Historical Society, and is credited with naming Indiana's new capital "Indianapolis". 500 West Street, Madison, IN 47250 (812)265-2967 Fax (812)273-3941

Lanier Manison State Historic Site: Designated a National Historic Landmark, this Greek Revival mansion was the home of James Lanier, whose loans to the state of Indiana enabled the state to equip Union troops during the Civil War. 511 West 1st Street, Madison, IN 47250 (812)265-3526 Fax (812)265-3501
