VISITOR ATTRACTIONS

Claudia Sanders Dinner House - Adjacent to Blackwood Hall, the 125-year-old former home of Harland Sanders and his wife Claudia that served as the base of operations for Kentucky Fried Chicken. The home was destroyed by fire in 1999, and the 24,000 square foot dinner house was erected next door, continuing a tradition of hosting diners in groups small and large with Southern hospitality and "down-home" cooking. 3202 Shelbyville Road, Shelbyville. Old Stone Inn - One of the oldest stone houses in Kentucky, built in 1817 by slave labor with stones taken from a quarry on the farm site of this former frontier coach stop. Its two-foot thick stone walls, still bearing bullet holes from the Civil War, enclose a fine restaurant and a small bed-and-breakfast. 6905 Shelbyville Road, Simpsonville. (502) 722-8882.

Science Hill Preparatory School for Young Ladies - Now home to Wakefield-Scarce Galleries and The Shops of Science Hill, these buildings served as a College Preparatory School for Girls from 1824 until 1939. 525 Washington St., Shelbyville. (502)633-6388.

Stanley-Casey House - This home, dating to the early 1800s, was the birthplace of Augustus Owsley Stanley, Kentucky Governor from 1915-1919. It later was used as a school for boys, and from 1901-1985 was home to the Casey family. Shelbyville. (502) 633-6388.
